serves as a competition adjudicator for many local and statewide piano competitions.

A winner of numerous competitions and an active solo and chamber musician, Dale frequently performs locally and in Europe and Asia. As a core member of the Ensemble for These Times, she has championed 20th and 21st century music and collaborated in many commissions, premieres and international performances. Her collaborative work on E4TT recordings resulted in a 2016 Silver Medal and a 2018 Gold Medal from the Global Music Awards. She enthusiastically continues to disseminate the music of living composers. Dale is married to her best friend and favorite composer David Garner, and is a mother to two wonderful college kids.
